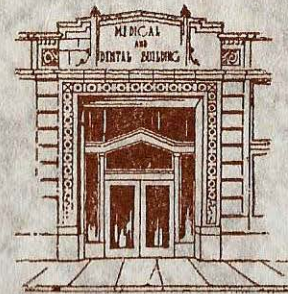

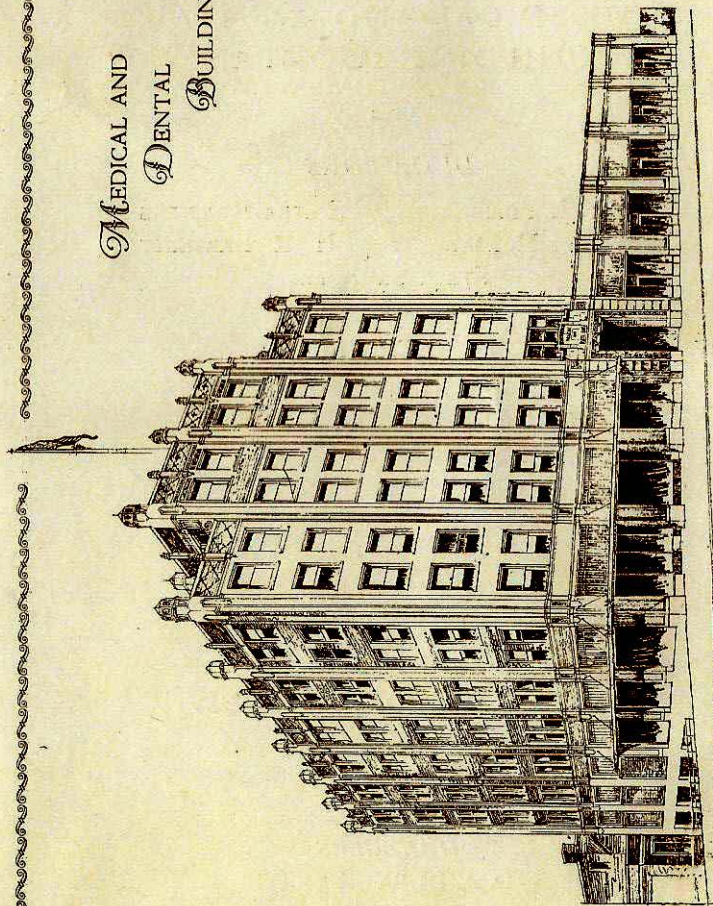

Medical and Dental Building

THE people of Everett, Washington, have a right to be proud of the achievements of their city. Many fine buildings have been erected. Among them we mention two new hospitals which represent the last word in construction and equipment. With the completion of the Medical & Dental Building, Everett's largest office building, the city has taken another step forward by providing unexcelled facilities to medical and dental men for the practice of their professions.

The location is at the corner of Colby Avenue and California Street, the highest point in the downtown section, affording from the upper floors a commanding view of the city, mountains, river and bay. Evidence of the need and the inevitable popularity of this building among professional people and the public at large is clearly shown in the fact that nearly all of the offices have already been rented.

The Medical & Dental Building is a seven-story reinforced concrete office building, faced with light brick and terra cotta. It is practically fireproof, sound proof and time proof.

The architecture is of the Classical Renaissance, the interior woodwork is mahogany and the concrete floors are overlaid with maple. The corridors are of terrazzo. The entrance and lobby are ornamented with marble. The high speed elevator is of unusual size, affording ample room for the carrying of stretchers.

The plot of ground measures 110 feet on California Street by 150 feet on Colby Avenue. The office portion of the building has a frontage on Colby Avenue of 67 feet and on California Street of 110 feet. The one-story, with a frontage of 83 feet on Colby Avenue, has been constructed to carry six additional stories which the company expects to build as soon as the demand for more office space will warrant.

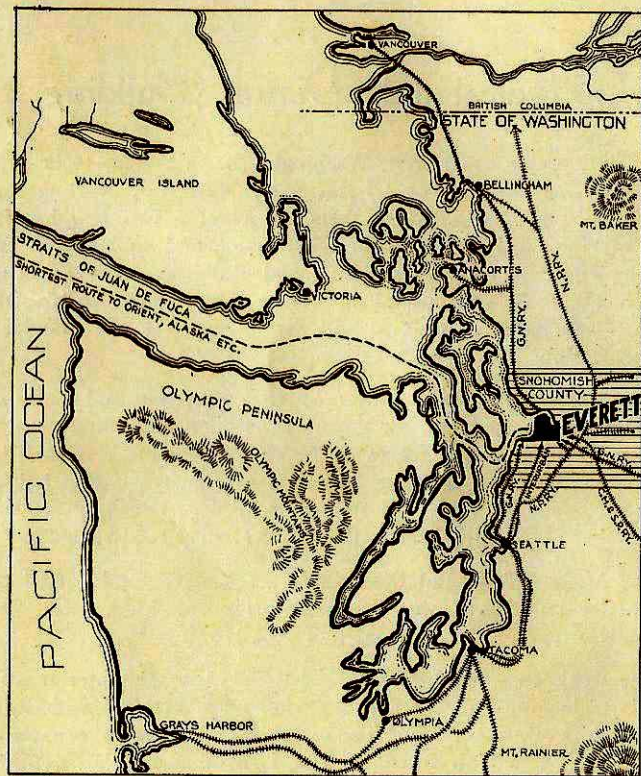
The City of Everett

NO small amount of favorable comment has arisen regarding the City of Everett, Washington, because of its substantial growth. Located on a peninsula formed by the Snohomish River and Port Gardner Bay, it has proved to be an ideal home and manufacturing city.

Even for a western city, it is young. Surveys for plats were made in 1891. The Plat of Everett was filed in 1892. The municipality was incorporated in 1893. The census for 1900 was 7,838; for 1920 it was 27,644, and at the close of 1925, the population is estimated to be 35,000.

Everett is located 33 miles north of Seattle and is the center of the logging and lumbering industry of the Northwest. A variety of other manufactories including paper mill, steel and iron plants, salmon and fruit canneries, guarantee the permanency of its right to the appellation "City of Smokestacks," by which it is commonly known. It is the county seat of Snohomish County, the fourth city in size in the State, and a seaport of growing importance. It is the freight terminus of the Great Northern Railroad which first strikes tide water at Everett. The Northern Pacific Railway and the Chicago-Milwaukee and St. Paul Railway also enter the city on their own tracks. Ocean going vessels make this a port of regular call. In short, the city possesses practically all those natural endowments that have made other cities large and prosperous. Paved highways connect the city with rich valleys and nearby mountains of rare charm which appeal to the hunter, fisherman and tourist. Snohomish County, already famed for its timber, dairying, oats, berries, cherries and lettuce, includes mining and water power among its valued resources.

From the beginning, plans were made for a large city and our streets are from 80 to 100 feet in width, which have eliminated to a large extent the automobile congestion so prevalent in cities possessing narrow thoroughfares. Natural advantages coupled with a progressive citizenry stamp Everett as a city whose future growth and prosperity are assured.



EVERETT AND SNOHOMISH COUNTY hold the very central location on Puget Sound, as is illustrated in the above map. Here the Great Northern, shortest railway route across the continent, first reaches tide water; and from the Port of Everett is the shortest shipping route across the Pacific to the Orient. The advantages of this natural location, from the standpoint of commerce and industry, are, therefore, plainly apparent.
